Dear Sir:

Your favour of 9th November is duly to hand, from which I perceived that I should have written to you on the motive of my proposal of 1st October for the distribution of the Nobel Prize of Peace recommending Lord Baden-Powell of Gilwell, England. I beg your pardon for my negligence.

Lord Baden-Powell is the founder of the Boy Scout Movement, which has since 1908 the spirit of the Worldwide Brotherhood as its principle, has led the rising generation of every country in the world to the understanding of one another, and through the very friendship of the boys has done a great deal to the establishment of the World's Peace.

This motive of my proposal is the same as that of the proposal made by

Mr. Tage Carstensen, Denmark,
Dr. Sven E. Donner, Rev. Verner Louhivuori, Mr. Eric Wass-
tröm, Rev. Niilo Visapää, and Rev. Leo R. Böök, of Finland,
Mr. Hegli Thomasson, and Mr. Leifur Gudmundsson, of Iceland,
Mr. H. Möller Gasman, and Dr. Ragnvald Iversen, of Norway,
H.R.H. Gustaf Adolf, and Mr. Sten Thiel, of Sweden,
which, I hear, was made last summer. I think you can find more detailed explanations of the life work of Lord Baden-Powell in that proposal, and I shall be much obliged if you will kindly look into it again.
