**FLAG DAY IS  
NOW URGED.**

**ARMSTRONG SUGGESTS ALL  
MOTORISTS CARRY COLORS.**

**Local Automobile Dealer Wishes  
to See Every Car in State Dis-  
playing National Emblem on  
Flag Day—Tourists on Lincoln  
Highway to Observe Day.**

Observance of Flag Day, June 14, is urged upon all motorists of Southern California by Earl V. Armstrong, president of the Chandler Motor Car Company of California. He suggests that it would be a patriotic move for all autoists on that day to display the national emblem on their cars.

Mr. Armstrong does not advocate draping the car in huge flags to make it appear as if it contained the speaker for a political meeting nor in wrapping it in yards of bunting. He believes a small flag attached to the radiator cap or one to each side of the windshield is quite sufficient.

An effort is on foot to have motorists in all the cities and towns along the Lincoln highway to display the colors on Flag Day. Mr. Armstrong does not want to see it limited to this one route, however. He believes that if the proposition is good enough to receive support across the continent, it is good enough for California to adopt. He would have all the California State highways included.

"No one can imagine a prettier and more inspiring sight than to see the 180,000 automobiles in California displaying the national emblem on at least this one day," Mr. Armstrong says. "This is the era of preparedness and certainly nothing so stimulates patriotism as the presence of the flag.

"It is the intention of our company to get behind the movement and try to create sentiment. We shall urge all Chandler users to have flags on their cars on this date. Perhaps other dealers will see fit to follow the example and if it proves popular by next year the plan can be adopted as an annual custom."
